Dear Church Family and Friends,

As I think of the fall I think of change and how change is built in nature. And the question that comes to mind is this, is God constant or are there changes in God? Some ancient Philosophers decided that if God is perfect, any change in God would have to be toward imperfection. Therefore, they declared, God does not change and change cannot affect God. Remember, *PIE stands for Participate, Interact, and Experience*. Look for more information coming up in your bulletins.


