

VISION: Sharing with the community to transform our lives through Christ.

MISSION: Living faithfully and generously to share Christ's love. **COMMITMENT:** When we help those in need we are helping Jesus, who loves all.

Here is a brief history of the "Free Store". It was established through the vision, training & efforts of Pastor Dave Blackwell, Sallie Van Curen, several members of this congregation, along with the District Missions Committee of the New Mexico Conference of the United Methodist Church in **2010**. Through the years, members of Peralta Church have served on the Board, and also volunteered at the Free Store, but more help is always needed.

The Free Store is open to the community to receive goods for free – there are no eligibility requirements. Shoppers do 'register' and may choose items their family needs based on certain quantity limitations. The Free Store is open for shopping, on Saturdays from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. Donations can be received on Mondays and/or Saturdays.

As many of you know, the little shed north of the Sanctuary is where donations can be left, which are then taken to the Free Store (by volunteers). If you don't know what types of items are accepted at the Free Store – Here is a brief list:

Toiletries – toothpaste/brushes; soap; deodorant; lotion; shampoo; diapers; feminine hygiene; razors/shave cream

Household Items – blankets; towels; rugs; SMALL appliances; dishes; pots/pans Clothing – men's; women's, teens; baby; shoes; underwear/socks; coats; sweaters; gloves Misc. Backpacks; luggage, children's books/toys,

Also needed to support the operation of the store are: **PRAYERS!!** – monetary donations will help with rent & utilities; tall kitchen bags; quart/gal zip-lock bags; cleaning supplies like Lysol/ pinesol/ laundry detergent; cookies and coffee for devotional time.

If you feel led to volunteer/help – here are ways to do that:

- Pick up donated items from Peralta Church and deliver to the Free Store
 - Volunteer at the Free Store on Mondays or Saturdays
 - Serve on the Board of the Free Store
